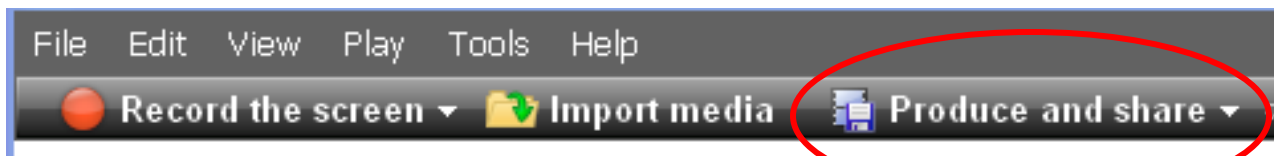
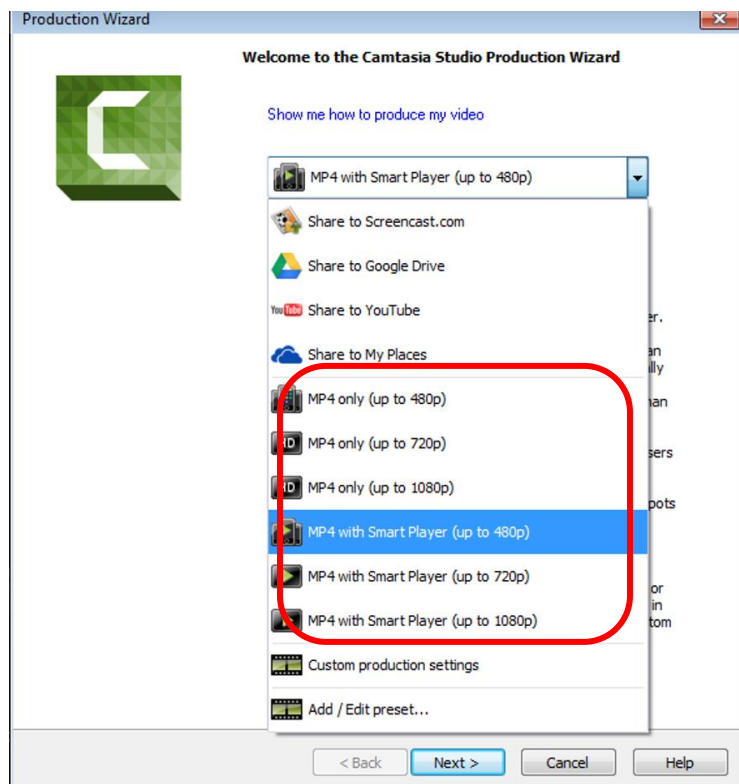


How to Upload your Camtasia video into Desire 2 Learn

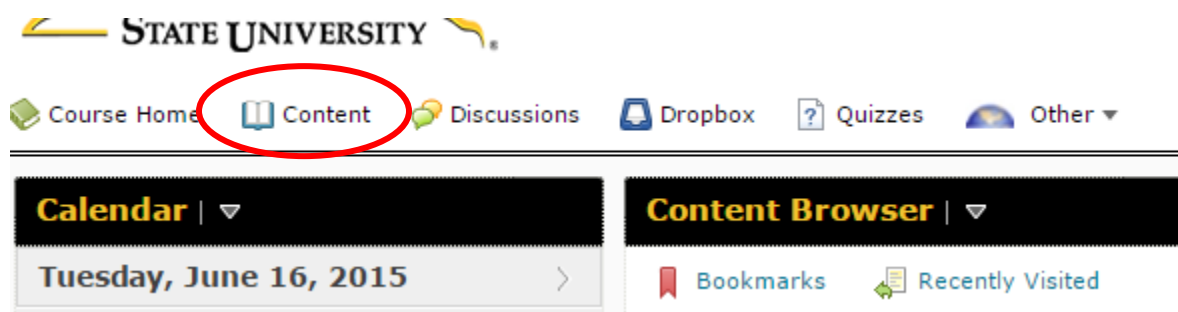
1. Once you have created your Camtasia video and saved it as a .camproj (extension), share the project by clicking on **“Produce and Share”** located in your top tool bar. (If you are completely unfamiliar with Camtasia, see the “Getting Started with Camtasia Tutorial”.



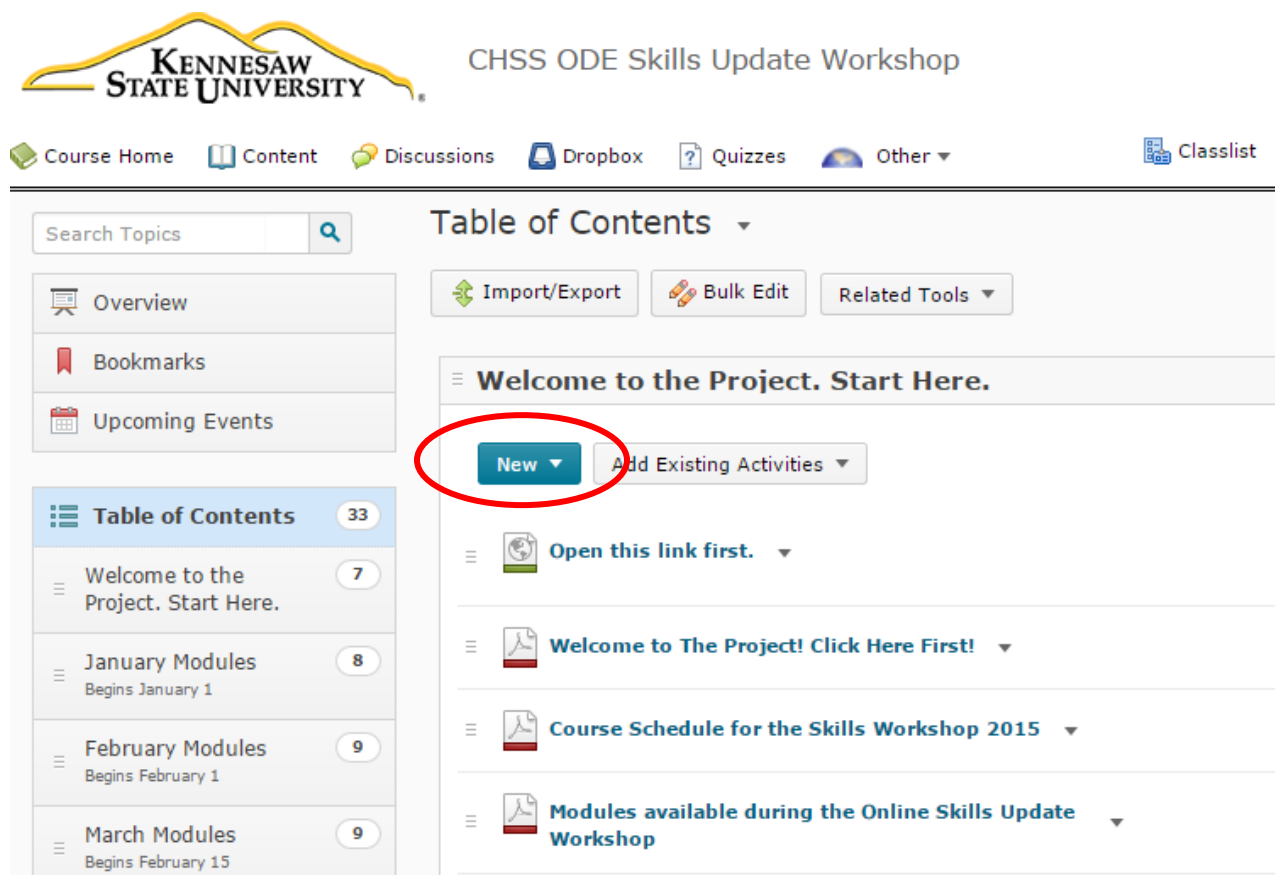
2. Click the dropdown on the Studio Production Wizard screen. You will need to create an .mp4. Depending on which version of Camtasia you are using, you could various choices, but to make your video mobile friendly you most likely will need to create an mp4.




3. Then select "Next".
4. Give the production a name (no spaces) and browse your folders to add the file to (Remember where you put it). Finally, select "**Finish**".
5. While your video is processing, enter your D2L classroom by going to d2l.kennesaw.edu and signing in. Select the course that you plan to upload the video in.
6. Now select "Content".



7. Now select the module by clicking on the box next to it, and select "**New**".

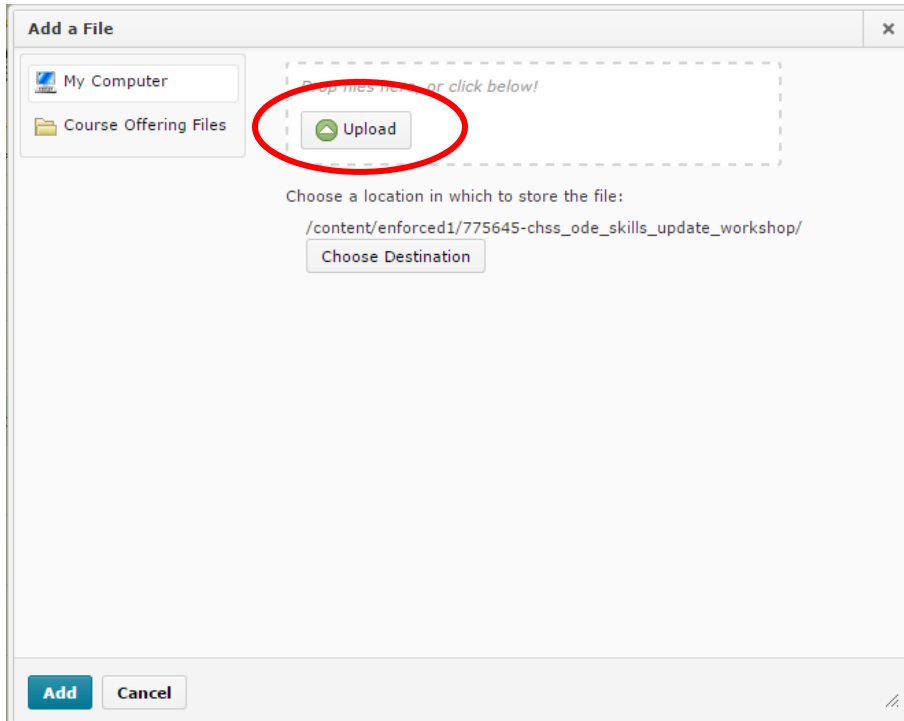


8. Now select **“Upload Files”**.

9. On the new page, select the upload button again. Select the file you created in Camtasia by locating it in your computer library and click the “Add” button.



10. You can change or provide a name to the video by click the arrow to the right of the file and select “Edit Properties In-Place.”

11. Once you have uploaded the file, you can view the file by returning to course home, selecting the module, and viewing the presentation.
